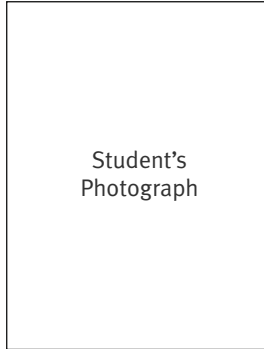

A note to the Parents

Parent-teacher relationship

- Maximum co-operation between the parents and the school is necessary for drawing out the best in the child.
- Parents should carry out their responsibilities to educate and instill in their children respect and obedience for all school rules and regulations.
- As the medium of instruction in this school is English, children should be helped to follow their classes easily and intelligently by certain amount of regular English conversation at home.
- Parents are requested to sign the teacher's remarks in the school diary and other circulars so that they keep in close touch with the progress of their children.
- Parents are not allowed to visit their children or the teachers in the class rooms during school hours.

Parents, Please Note

- If a child lives with criticism, he/she learns to condemn.
- If a child lives with hostility, he/she learns to be apprehensive.
- If a child lives with pity, he/she learns to feel sorry for himself/herself.
- If a child lives with ridicule, he/she learns to be shy.

Guidelines for Parents/Guardians

- 1) Kindly check nails, hair and uniforms daily and ensure the cleanliness of your ward.
- 2) Please see that your ward carries text /exercise books according to the timetable for that day.
- 3) The ALMANAC should be brought to the school daily.
- 4) See his /her report card and teacher's remarks in his /her class work/homework, exercise books and school Almanac.
- 5) Ensure that your ward takes balanced interest in studies and physical, cultural, social and literary activities.
- 6) Encourage healthy eating habits; give a healthy breakfast and home cooked food in your ward's tiffin box. Regulate his/her sleeping hours. At least 8 hours sleep is essential for the healthy growth and development of a child.
- 7) The students are not allowed to bring expensive articles or to wear jewellery in the school. In case of violation of this rule the articles will be confiscated. The school bears no responsibility for articles lost in the school. In case of a loss, a letter giving details of the lost items may be sent to the class teacher.
- 8) If your ward is absent from the school, (he/she) must make-up for all the work that has been missed and also bring a leave application duly signed by the parents.
- 9) If your ward is to leave the school campus during school hours, he/she must bring a written note from the parents explicitly stating the reason, get it signed by the class teacher and obtain a gate pass from the principal. Parents must make arrangements for their children to go home in case of an emergency.
- 10) Parents should promptly inform the school if there is any change in their address or telephone numbers.

- 11) Every precaution is taken to avoid accidents. However, if an accident occurs in the school, first aid will be given. It may be done even before informing the parents/guardians. Ordinarily they will be sent to the hospital nearest to the school. Hospital expenses must be borne by the parents/guardians.
- 12) Encourage your ward to speak in English at home. It will be good to provide him / her story books, newspapers, magazine in English etc.
- 13) Expose your wards to all kind of safe, religiously allowed and socially acceptable experiences.
- 14) Appreciate your ward for all his/her good doings and encourage him/her to shoulder responsibilities, in accordance with his/her physical and mental capabilities.
- 15) Never compare your child with other children. Always have a good word to say about your child in the presence of friends, relatives and visitors.
- 16) It is the policy of the school as a rule to discourage private tuitions as a pupil should be able to progress in his/her work as result of good teaching in the school. When private tuitions become necessary they may not be undertaken by the subject teacher concerned, and no teacher may take private tuitions for the students of the School.

SCHOOL RULES

1. Attendance:

- ◆ Students must arrive to school on time, and leave school only after the final school bell is rung. Students arriving late to school are reminded about being on time, with a note on their diaries. The third late coming in a month will automatically requires that the student be sent home that day and all consecutive days when he/she is late to school, during the rest of the term.
- ◆ Outside the vacation period students are not granted long leave. Prior permission should be sought for absence from the school for any reason known or planned in advance. If a student needs leave, a leave application should be submitted to the school duly countersigned by his/her parent. If a student remains absent from the school for ten days without prior leave application, the name of the student will be struck off from the School Rolls and he/she will be granted admission only on payment of all arrears and fresh admission fee Rs. 3000/-.
- ◆ In case of infectious diseases the parents are required to submit a medical certificate that the child is fit to rejoin.
- ◆ No student is allowed to leave the school before closing hours unless, in special cases, the parent of student comes to take him/her personally with the prior permission of the Principal.
- ◆ Confirmation regarding any unscheduled holidays can be done by checking the school website or the notice board at the gate or through circulars.

2. Fees:

- ◆ Tuition Fees and conveyance Charges shall be paid for the whole month irrespective of the date of admission in that month. Admission fees, Tuition Fees, Conveyance charges or any other charges once deposited shall not be refunded.
- ◆ A calendar month's notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice shall be given by the parent for withdrawal of his ward from the school.
- ◆ Those who leave the school in April or May will have to pay the fees upto and including the month of June. Similarly, those who leave the school in November or December shall pay the fees upto and including the month of January. Withdrawal letter from the school will be issued only when all the dues are paid.

3. P.T.M:

- ◆ The parents/guardians of the students are not allowed to go to the class rooms or to meet a teacher during the teaching hours.
- ◆ Parents who regularly fail to attend Parent- Teacher meetings will be considered to be not interested in their ward's education as this is pernicious to the school in general and the student in particular, the student maybe asked to discontinue.
- ◆ On completion of the terminal examination, report cards should be personally collected by the Parents/Guardians.
- ◆ Besides the meetings arranged regularly, parents are expected to attend emergency/special meetings as per the requests made through the diary or through special notes.

4. Cleanliness:

- ◆ Students must come to school in neat and well pressed school uniforms. Those coming in crumpled or stained uniforms or unpolished shoes are liable to be sent back home or fined.
- ◆ Nails and hair of students should be trimmed on regular basis. Hair of every student should be combed properly to give a decent look.
- ◆ It is the duty of all the students to keep their classrooms and other places in and around the school clean and in order; they should cultivate the habit of using the dustbin.
- ◆ Before leaving the classrooms students will pick up waste paper and any unwanted material and place it in the paper basket; will leave desks and chairs in proper arrangement; will put off lights and fans.

5. Library:

- ◆ Students are expected to take care of the library books. Writing or marking on the book is strictly forbidden.
- ◆ Damages/Loss of book while in possession of the student will have to be made good by the student in whose name the book has been issued.

6. School Property:

- ◆ Every student should take care of the school property.
- ◆ If a student causes any damage to the school property, he/she shall be fined, the amount of which will be decided by the Principal.
- ◆ Damage done even by accident by any student should be reported at once to the class teacher or the Incharge.

7. School Diary:

- ◆ Every student must possess the school diary which should be brought to school everyday.

- ◆ The school diary is to be preserved carefully and no page from it should be torn or smudged.
- ◆ Parents are expected to look into and sign the school diary everyday.
- ◆ If a student loses the diary, he/she will have to purchase a new diary after paying Rs. 100/-.

Rules for Students

1. Long leaves are not in the school norms except for medical reasons, where only after medical report leave can be approved. Half day or early leave will be considered only for genuine and convincing reasons (serious illness, death of near ones, family functions, natural calamities, untoward incidents, etc). Any type of leave will however be granted on the written request of one of the parents/guardians. In case the school grants the leave parents/guardians are to collect their ward/s.
2. No leave request will be entertained during Periodic / Oral exams/ Half yearly or Annual exams except in medical emergencies.
3. Those who come late or remain absent on the previous day must bring a note in the school diary, giving reason for late coming or being absent duly signed by one of the parents/guardian.
4. If a child remains absent for three consecutive days without any information or permission, one of the parents accompany the child and meet the principal to explain the circumstances.
5. Name of the student will be struck of the rolls if he/she is absent continuously for a period of ten working days (excluding holidays) without any written information or permission. Readmission procedure will be followed with charging of Rs. 3000/- as re-admission fee. Granting readmission is at the discretion of the school authorities. It cannot be claimed as a right.
6. Whenever a student is ill for more than three days, an application from the parent/guardian, enclosing the medical certificate from the attending doctor, should be submitted.
7. The students are expected to have at least 75% of attendance to be eligible to appear in the annual examination. Parents must understand that frequent or long leaves/periods of absence hampers the

academic progress of their wards.

- 8.** No student shall indulge in any of the following practices, namely a) smoking b) Bringing objectionable material to school or exchanging it. c) Rowdyism or rude behaviour. d) use of violence in any form. e) use of abusive language
- 9.** If any student is found indulged into any of the above activities, the school reserves the right to suspend or rusticate the student.
- 10.** Students should respect every teacher whether of their own class or not. Be grateful towards those who taught them in the past. They should show their teachers those exterior signs of reverence to which they are entitled, such as greeting whenever they meet them.

Scheme of Examination and Evaluation

- ◆ The Scholar School has revised the Assessment structure and Examination pattern for all the classes in tune with the directives given by Central Board of Secondary Education. The School is implementing the uniform system of assessment, examination pattern and the issue of report card for all classes (I to VIII). The scheme has been designed on Term Assessment basis with gradual increase in the learning assessment as the students move forward. This initiative would prepare the students to cover the whole syllabus of the academic year and ensure the 'quality of education'.
- ◆ The assessment is done through Periodic Assessments, Examinations, Evaluation of Assignments and activities.
- ◆ The Grading System in the Scholastic Areas will be as per the following :
